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SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

Introduction to the different creative processes and artistic tools for fashion illustration in its various aspects: figure drawing, fashion illustration, and garment representation. The course is aimed at developing the various technical and creative resources of drawing, from the initial phase of a collection to its completion.

The subject is taught in ENGLISH.

Drawing is the basic tool for visualizing ideas and concepts in fashion design. This course introduces techniques and procedures to illustrate ideas, represent designs and achieve imaginative results. Consequently, it is a complement to the creation of fashion collections, and a basic skill for more complex projects in later courses. The course will also introduce specific English for the fashion designer and illustrator, providing vocabulary and

communication skills for creative and professional work.

GOAL

The main goal of the course is to teach students the tools and knowledge necessary to develop and express their creations through drawing.

Another main purpose is to present various artistic and creative techniques for drawing and representing designs and their technical specifications.

The specific aims of the subject are:

Present the fundamentals of fashion design drawing.

Teach various graphic and representation techniques for fashion drawing

Present basic guidelines to represent fashion creations and collections graphically.

Analyze the poses in fashion illustration, taking into account both the human figure and the fabrics/materials.

Teach how to project fashion designs graphically, using different artistic techniques and representation methods.

Introduce appropriate drawing methods to create personal fashion projects.

Promote creativity through the exercise of drawing.

Introduce English as a communication tool in the creative and professional context for the fashion designer.

Provide specific vocabulary in English for fashion design.

PRIOR KNOWLEDGE

B1 English Level (basic level of English required for the access to university). Contents that the student will acquire in parallel to this subject, in courses such as Painting, Drawing, Technology...

COURSE SYLLABUS

The subject is structured through 4 transversal blocks, which are progressively developed through exercises and projects:

- 1. Introduction to drawing Fundamentals of representation in fashion drawing Materials and surfaces Basic drawing techniques Color application techniques
- 2. The fashion figure. Human figure and poses Representation of garments Representation of textures and motifs. Fashion illustration styles. The search for your own style.
- 3. Artistic and creative resources for fashion figurines Methods for generating creative content. -The inspiration panel or moodboard. -The conceptual and artistic design -Figurine and fashion illustration -Analog and digital collage
- 4. The importance of fashion drawings and sketches for the designer. Main objectives of fashion drawing The representation of ideas Graphic samples: "From the sketch to the catwalk" Presenting a collection

EDUCATION ACTIVITIES

The methodology of the subject will be mainly practical. Classes and activities will be held in English, and the contents and materials will also be provided in the same language.

Teaching-learning activities will take place mainly in the classroom-workshop, through theoretical-visual presentations, work proposals, activities and practical exercises, both individually and in groups. In parallel, students will carry out autonomous work tasks outside the classroom. These tasks will include the development of proposals and field work.

An active and dynamic methodology based on practical exercises will be promoted, so each student can reflect their own artistic vision and creative capacity, as well as the expression and communication of these in English.

Preparatory and complementary activities will be proposed online through Canvas tool (Virtual Classroom).

Students will be asked to start a field notebook from the first day, where they can collect useful visual information for their projects: magazine clippings, photos, drawings, colors or textures that can serve as inspiration for further work, thus promoting a personal investigation in textile and fashion design.

The teacher will supervise exercises and make appropriate observations in each case. In each exercise proposed, the student will carry out two processes: one in the classroom (guided and directed by the teacher) and another one at home (where the student will apply the concepts developed in class).

Throughout the semester, various proposals for collections, costumes and technical drawings will be made, with different elements of inspiration.

There will be at least one external visit to a fashion exhibition or to the Costume Museum, to observe and draw designs in situ, becoming familiar with fashionable environments.

All the drawings - both classroom and home - will be kept by the students in a portfolio that will be presented at the end of the course in order to analyze their progress.

The student uses various strategies and languages of visual creation (drawing, inspiration panel, application of color, analog and digital collage) for the expression and communication of fashion concepts.

The student shows appreciation of fashion and aesthetics, as well as visual disciplines related to fashion.

The student demonstrates the ability to create a collection from the beginning, developing both the figurines and style elements.

The student communicates ideas, projects and fashion design works in English effectively.

LEARNING APPRAISAL SYSTEM

Class attendance is mandatory and will be monitored. The exercises carried out will be graded according to the following evaluation criteria:

- -Understanding, development and internalization of the technical procedures used. -Level of material resolution, and adaptation to expressive intentions.
- -Degree of sensitive, structural and conceptual complexity. -Personal response to contemporary fashion in any of its manifestations.
- -Capacity for experimentation, and signs of innovation in the fields of design and fashion.
- -Cleanliness, neatness and creativity in the presentation of work.

The evaluation methods will be:

- -Continuous work in class -Assignments / work submissions
- -Final exam -Portfolio with all the course work
- -Attendance and participation in classes and complementary activities
