SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

The subject of Fundamental Anthropology II, continuation of the subject Fundamental Anthropology I, which belongs to the module and material of Humanities, reflects on and studies man as an entity and issues related to his personal and community existence.

SKILLS

Basic Skills

Students must have demonstrated knowledge and understanding in an area of study that is founded on general

secondary education. Moreover, the area of study is typically at a level that includes certain aspects implying knowledge at the forefront of its field of study, albeit supported by advanced textbooks

To analyse and summarise the main ideas and contents of all types of texts, discover their theories and the issues they pose and critically judge their form and contents in terms of both the texts and the underlying rhetoric.

Specific skills

To be able to analyse the meaning and basis of human dignity, the basic elements of mankind, the evolution of the different anthropologies over history and their practical implications on the sector.

To identify and appreciate the metaphysical and anthropological essence of ethics and to define moral experience, its specific nature and its essential characteristics.
