SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

The Experimental Creation course is in the Creative Strategies and Artistic Processes module, the main objective of which is for students to learn about other means of Artistic Creation and to discover new fields available for them to do their work.

The Experimental Creation course is intended to contribute to the theoretical and practical training of today¿s creator. As a continuation of work from previous years it is therefore intended to convey a creative approach both from a practical standpoint, through the figure of the artist Eugenio Ampudia, and a theoretical perspective, as it introduces the latest trends in contemporary art.

SKILLS

Basic Skills

Students must have demonstrated knowledge and understanding in an area of study that is founded on general secondary education. To have the ability to be intellectually curious professionals who avoid weak, ineffectual thought and who aspire to improve modern culture by conveying values founded on a search for the truth, good and beauty.

To form a part of the professional world as a new creator, carrying out artistic works, programmes and projects for production and presentation in all kinds of formats and cultural spaces.

Specific skills

To be familiar with the artistic methods usually applied to socio-cultural projects.

To have acquired the necessary skills for creatively and imaginatively facing up to artistic challenges.

To have acquired the ability to produce ideas and link them together during the creative process.

To possess a critical understanding of the need to develop one's own artistic field.
