SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

It entails consideration of the meaning of life, the existence of God, the possibility of revelation and analysis of the reasonableness of the notion of Christianity in all its dimensions.

SKILLS

Basic / general / cross skills

Students must have demonstrated knowledge and understanding in an area of study that is founded on general secondary education. Moreover, the area of study is typically at a level that includes certain aspects implying

knowledge at the forefront of its field of study, albeit supported by advanced textbooks

Students must be able to apply their knowledge to their work or vocation in a professional manner and possess skills that can typically be demonstrated by coming up with and sustaining arguments and solving problems within their field of study

Students must have the ability to gather and interpret relevant data (usually within their field of study) in order to make judgments that include reflections on pertinent social, scientific or ethical issues

Students must be able to convey information, ideas, problems and solutions to both an expert and non-expert audience

Students must have developed the learning skills needed to undertake further study with a high degree of independence

To be able to convey the reality of the world and mankind, including its religious foundations, to users of media and help them understand it.

To acquire the ability to consider and creatively respond to the essential questions as to the whys and wherefores, and the consequences of human, social, political and economic events.

To acquire critical, analytical, synthetic, reflective, theoretical and practical thought, to be able to understand reality and convey it using the media.

Specific skills

To appreciate the roots of Christian humanism in Western culture and the real meaning of its theological and anthropological claim, in order to contextualise all information relating to the West and to benefit from references for greater informative objectivity.

To reasonably set out ideas on the basis of argumentation and rhetoric.

To develop a theoretical and practical project expanding on certain areas of communication and journalism.
