SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

La Política Criminal, en un sentido amplio, hace referencia a las estrategias y medios de prevención y control de la criminalidad. Con el estudio de esta asignatura la pretensión es que los alumnos obtengan y consoliden una base de conocimientos teóricos y prácticos sobre los Fundamentos de Política Criminal, como conjunto de estrategias y medidas tendentes al control de la criminalidad, en el marco de un Estado Social y Democrático de Derecho, que propugna como valores superiores de su ordenamiento jurídico la libertad, la justicia, la igualdad y el pluralismo político. Tal y como lo define la Constitución Española de 1978 en su artículo 1.
