## SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

El estudio de la presente asignatura permitirá delimitar terminológicamente la violencia doméstica y la violencia de género como problemáticas presentes en la criminalidad actual. Conocer las diferentes tipologías, así como sus características, permitirá definir las diferentes dinámicas de las relaciones de maltrato, los factores de riesgo y los factores de protección. Se abordarán de manera específica la victimización de aquellas víctimas denominadas especialmente vulnerables: mujer, menor, ancianos.

## Basic Skills

To analyse the transformations and development of modern societies and their political and social movements.

To understand and value the influence of psychological characteristics, the psychosocial environment and the psychopathological and psychosociological processes linked to criminal behaviour and victimisation processes.

To design preventive policies for minors applying knowledge of relevant psychological processes and characteristics.

To be familiar with and analyse the phenomenon of common, street crime; contemporary delinquency and new forms of criminal activity (domestic and gender-related violence, organised crime, cybercrime, terrorism, etc.), white collar crime, corporate crime, etc. Likewise, to be familiar with the various national and international responses to these criminal phenomena.
