SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

Basic Skills

To be familiar with and analyse the phenomenon of common, street crime; contemporary delinquency and new forms of criminal activity (domestic and gender-related violence, organised crime, cybercrime, terrorism, etc.), white collar crime, corporate crime, etc. Likewise, to be familiar with the various national and international responses to these criminal phenomena.
