SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

Modern Language II is a compulsory course, which carries 6 ECTS credits, implying 150 hours of dedication on the learner's part. It is taught in the Seventh Semester of the Fourth Year of the Business Management and Administration Degree studies. This course is embodied within the Area of Idiomas and within the module: Business management and human development tools. Modern Language II forms part of a well rounded, integral education focused on the learner in all of his or her harmoniously integrated dimensions (intelligence, will, emotional nature, sociability, abilities, skills...).

SKILLS

Basic Skills

Students must have demonstrated knowledge and understanding in an area of study that is founded on general secondary education. Moreover, the area of study is typically at a level that includes certain aspects implying knowledge at the forefront of its field of study, albeit supported by advanced textbooks

Students must have developed the learning skills needed to undertake further study with a high degree of independence

Specific skills
