SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

A continuación se estudia el concepto de Patrimonio como fuente de riqueza de la empresa y cuya gestión debe contribuir al bien social a través de la maximización del beneficio.

El estudio de la técnica contable necesaria para posteriormente aprender a elaborar los estados financieros. Se incide en la comprensión del efecto que los registros contables tendrán en las cuentas anuales.

Una iniciación al análisis de los estados financieros, básicamente El Balance, la Cuenta de Pérdidas y Ganancias y el Estado de flujos de Efectivo.
