To analyse the historical, social, economic, political, philosophical, ethical, cultural and religious context of the different legal, economic and social institutions.

To carry out the various stages of research.

To critically judge the essence and content of texts and documents having a university-level complexity, as well as cultural, literary and scientific works.

To reflect on one's learning with self-criticism, identifying areas for improvement based on criteria of quality and excellence.

To identify the process of personal accomplishment, the goals to be attained and the difficulties to overcome by organising an action plan to this end.
