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## SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

En esta asignatura se estudian los llamados "mecanismos alternativos de resolución de conflictos" (alternative dispute resolution, ADR). Se trata de proporcionar al alumno una visión general de los sistemas que existen para arreglar controversias de manera satisfactoria sin necesidad de acudir a la vía judicial, profundizando en su marco legal nacional e internacional.

Concretamente, las técnicas objeto de análisis son cuatro: la negociación, la mediación, la conciliación y el arbitraje.
