# **SUBJECT DESCRIPTION**

Conocer el marco regulador del contrato de seguro y, en particular, la Ley de Contrato de Seguro (LCS). Profundizar en las disposiciones generales de la LCS y en los distintos ramos de seguros, distinguiendo en su estudio, los seguros de daños y los seguros de personas, haciendo especial hincapié en los seguros de responsabilidad civil, por ser los más problemáticos.
