SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

La primera parte de la asignatura explica el matrimonio canónico, estudiándolo y analizando cada una de sus propiedades y fines.

Una segunda parte, analiza el consentimiento que da vida al matrimonio y cuáles son las anomalías que invalidan el mismo.

Por último, se estudia la Revalidación del matrimonio como parte importante a tener en cuenta al ser conscientes los esposos de la nulidad de su matrimonio.
