SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

To define the existential dimension of human beings: freedom, responsibility and potential for change in psychology.

To be familiar with the historical stages of psychology up to the moment when it is defined as a science.

To identify the links between today's world and historical events and to acknowledge the need to define the historical framework of any event in order to understand it.

To be familiar with the key scientific advances in the evolution of psychology.

To be familiar with the development of the main theoretical models in psychology: the points in history at which they appear, contributions made and limitations.
