### SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

Es en un ámbito tan complejo como el mundo forense, donde aspectos profundamente humanos se ponen en juego en situaciones (a menudo) extremas, en las cuales será fundamental contemplar a la persona en todas sus dimensiones desde una fundamentación antropológica integradora. Esta posición facilitará el análisis y la reflexión sobre las limitaciones y reduccionismos existentes en algunas disciplinas forenses, como son la psicología jurídica y/o la criminología. De este modo, se podrá acceder a la dimensión ética de la disciplina, impregnando los contenidos de la asignatura de una comprensión integral de aspectos tan complejos como pueden ser la conducta delictiva, la función de la pena o la posibilidad rehabilitadora del victimario en la sociedad, entre otros. Asimismo, el compromiso ético, personal y humano del profesional interviniente se antoja un elemento esencial, tanto con su disciplina científica como con la sociedad. Por todo ello, la psicología forense y la criminología, constituyen disciplinas relacionadas con otras áreas del conocimiento, cuya finalidad es contribuir a la búsqueda de la verdad y de este modo ayudar a alcanzar resoluciones judiciales lo más justas posibles.
