SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

Los contenidos de la asignatura parten del concepto de documentación como disciplina científica y proporcionan a los alumnos los conocimientos básicos de una ciencia multidisciplinar como es la documentación.

La asignatura se centra en primer lugar en la necesidad de la documentación como fundamento de toda información y en concreto de la documentación de carácter audiovisual.

Se introduce al alumno en la investigación desarrollando los fundamentos de la metodología del trabajo universitario y científico.

En segundo lugar se exponen los mecanismos y procesos que sigue la información desde que es producida hasta que llega a los usuarios. Se desarrollan y aplican las distintas fuentes de información que son consideradas como

imprescindibles para poder documentar el trabajo profesional enseñando al alumno el tratamiento y la recuperación de la información documental para llevar a cabo su actividad comunicativa.

Esta aproximación a las estrategias y recursos de búsqueda y recuperación de la información se aplica en la parte práctica de la asignatura donde los alumnos deberán utilizar estos recursos para elaborar una serie de contenidos audiovisuales. De manera que a través del trabajo práctico puedan experimentar las dificultades propias de la investigación y la búsqueda documental derivadas del proceso de creación de un contenido en formato audiovisual.

SKILLS

Basic Skills

Students must have demonstrated knowledge and understanding in an area of study that is founded on general secondary education. To learn how to acquire knowledge: to understand the dynamics of personal development through skills in communication, research, critical and creative thought, consideration and execution of action plans and teamwork.

Specific skills

To set out reasoned ideas on the basis of argumentation and rhetoric using any means of expression, but especially audio-visual resources.

To acquire an ability to define research topics that may contribute to raising the awareness of audio-visual media and to appropriately set out the findings of the research in line with the standards and norms of information and communication disciplines.
