SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

Knowledge of infant schools, of how they operate, of the people in them, their roles, responsibilities and relationships, and their material organisation as elements necessary and useful for the professional work of future teachers and their use as a resource for teaching and for pedagogical guidance, within the legal framework of education that directs teaching and learning processes towards the basic aims and objectives of the Spanish Education System.

SKILLS

Basic Skills

Students must have demonstrated knowledge and understanding in an area of study that is founded on general secondary education. Moreover, the area of study is typically at a level that includes certain aspects implying knowledge at the forefront of its field of study, albeit supported by advanced textbooks

Students must be able to apply their knowledge to their work or vocation in a professional manner and possess skills that can typically be demonstrated by coming up with and sustaining arguments and solving problems within their field of study

Students must have the ability to gather and interpret relevant data (usually within their field of study) in order to make judgments that include reflections on pertinent social, scientific or ethical issues

Students must be able to convey information, ideas, problems and solutions to both an expert and non-expert audience

Students must have developed the learning skills needed to undertake further study with a high degree of independence

General Skills

To understand the role, possibilities and limits of education in today's society and the core skills that affect early childhood education schools and professionals. To be familiar with quality improvement models implemented in schools.

To design and regulate learning areas in contexts of diversity, taking into consideration the specific educational needs of pupils, gender equality, egalitarianism and respect for human rights.

To promote coexistence inside and outside the classroom and promote the peaceful resolution of conflicts. To be able to systematically observe learning and coexistence contexts and to be able to reflect on them.

To be familiar with the organisation of kindergartens and the diversity of actions carried out in them. To accept that the practice of teaching must be improved and adapted to scientific, educational and social changes throughout one's life.

Specific skills

To be able to position early childhood education within the Spanish education system within the context of Europe and the world stage.

To learn about international experiences and examples of innovative practices in early childhood education.

To value the importance of teamwork.

To participate in the preparation and monitoring of early childhood education projects as part of school projects in cooperation with the community, other professionals and social agents.

To be familiar with the legislation governing kindergartens and their organisation.
